Floor Plan for World Religion Day

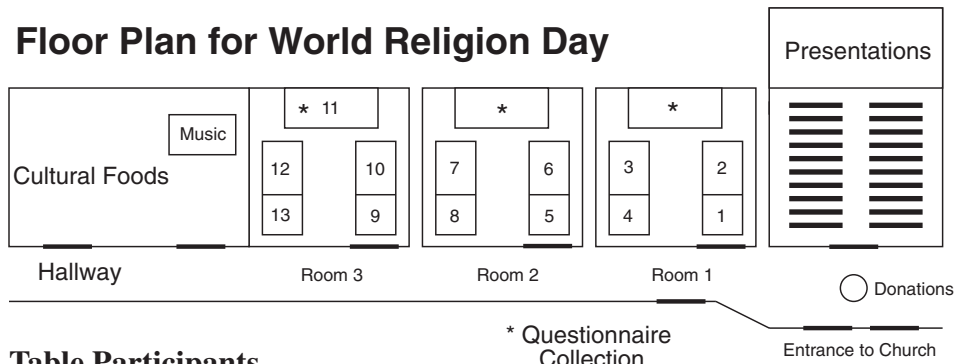
